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Item 1.01 Entry into a Material Definitive Agreement.

The information included in Item 2.03 of this Current Report on Form 8-K is incorporated by reference into this Item 1.01 of this Current Report on Form 8-K.

Item 2.03 Creation of a Direct Financial Obligation or an Obligation under an Off-Balance Sheet Arrangement of a Registrant.

On January 17, 2006, Inergy, L.P. (the Partnership) and its wholly-owned subsidiary, Inergy Finance Corp. (Finance Corp. and together with the Partnership, the Issuers), completed a private placement of \$200 million in aggregate principal amount of the Issuers' 8.25% senior unsecured notes due 2016 (the Senior Notes). On the same date, the Issuers entered into (i) an Indenture, dated as of January 17, 2006 (the Indenture), among the Issuers, the subsidiary guarantors named therein (the Guarantors) and U.S. Bank National Association, as trustee (the Trustee) and (ii) a Registration Rights Agreement, dated as of January 17, 2006, among the Issuers, the Guarantors and Lehman Brothers Inc., as representative of the several initial purchasers, each relating to the Senior Notes.

The Partnership will use the net proceeds of the offering of the Senior Notes to repay outstanding indebtedness under its revolving acquisition credit facility. Affiliates of each of the initial purchasers, Lehman Brothers Inc., J.P. Morgan Securities Inc., and Wachovia Capital Markets, LLC, are lenders under this credit facility.

The Senior Notes were issued pursuant to the Indenture in a transaction exempt from the registration requirements under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended (the Securities Act). The Senior Notes were sold within the United States only to qualified institutional buyers in reliance on Rule 144A under the Securities Act, and outside the United States only to non-U.S. persons in reliance on Regulation S under the Securities Act.

The Senior Notes will mature on March 1, 2016 and interest is payable on the Senior Notes on each March 1, and September 1, beginning on March 1, 2006. The Senior Notes are guaranteed on a senior unsecured basis by all of the Partnership's existing domestic subsidiaries and certain of the Partnership's future subsidiaries.

At any time prior to March 1, 2009, the Issuers may redeem up to 35% of the aggregate principal amount of notes issued under the Indenture at a redemption price of 108.25% of the principal amount of the Senior Notes, with the proceeds of certain equity offerings. On and after March 1, 2011, the Issuers may redeem some or all of the notes at redemption prices (expressed as percentages of principal amount) equal to 104.125% for the twelve-month period beginning on March 1, 2011, 102.750% for the twelve-month period beginning on March 1, 2012, 101.375% for the twelve-month period beginning on March 1, 2013 and 100.00% beginning on March 1, 2014 and at any time thereafter, plus accrued and unpaid interest.

The Indenture restricts the Partnership's ability and the ability of certain of its subsidiaries to: (i) sell assets; (ii) pay distributions on, redeem or repurchase its units or redeem or repurchase its subordinated debt; (iii) make investments; (iv) incur or guarantee additional indebtedness or issue preferred units; (v) create or incur certain liens; (vi) enter into agreements that restrict distributions or other payments from its restricted subsidiaries to the Partnership; (vii) consolidate, merge or transfer all or substantially all of its assets; and (viii) create unrestricted subsidiaries. These covenants are subject to a number of important exceptions and qualifications. At any time when the Senior Notes are rated investment grade by either of Moody's Investors Service, Inc. or Standard & Poor's Ratings Services and no Default or Event of Default (as defined in the Indenture) has occurred and is continuing, many of these covenants will terminate.

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The Indenture provides that each of the following is an Event of Default: (i) default for 30 days in the payment when due of interest on the Senior Notes; (ii) default in payment when due of the principal of, or premium, if any, on the Senior Notes; (iii) failure by the Partnership to comply with certain covenants relating to merger, consolidation, sale of assets or change of control; (iv) failure by the Partnership for 90 days after notice to comply with certain covenants relating to the filing of annual, quarterly and current reports as would be required to file with the Securities and Exchange Commission; (v) failure by the Partnership to comply for 60 days after notice with any of the other agreements in the Indenture; (vi) default under any mortgage, indenture or instrument under which there may be issued or by which there may be secured or evidenced any indebtedness for money borrowed by the Partnership or any of the Partnership's restricted subsidiaries (or the payment of which is guaranteed by the Partnership or any of its restricted subsidiaries), if that default: (a) is caused by a

failure to pay principal of, or interest or premium, if any, on such indebtedness prior to the expiration of the grace period provided in such indebtedness on the date of such default (a Payment Default); or (b) results in the acceleration of such indebtedness prior to its stated maturity, and, in each case, the principal amount of any such indebtedness, together with the principal amount of any other such indebtedness under which there has been a Payment Default or the maturity of which has been so accelerated, aggregates \$15.0 million or more; (vii) failure by the Partnership or any of the Partnership's restricted subsidiaries to pay final judgments aggregating in excess of \$15.0 million, which judgments are not paid, discharged or stayed for a period of 60 days; (viii) except as permitted by the Indenture, any subsidiary guarantee shall be held in any judicial proceeding to be unenforceable or invalid or shall cease for any reason to be in full force and effect or any Guarantor, or any person acting on behalf of any Guarantor, shall deny or disaffirm its obligations under its guarantee of the Senior Notes; and (ix) certain events of bankruptcy or insolvency described in the Indenture with respect to the Issuers or any of the Partnership's significant subsidiaries or any group of restricted subsidiaries that, taken as a whole, would constitute a significant subsidiary. In the case of an Event of Default arising from certain events of bankruptcy or insolvency with respect to either Issuer, any of the Partnership's significant subsidiaries or any group of restricted subsidiaries that, taken as a whole, would constitute a significant subsidiary, all outstanding Senior Notes will become due and payable immediately without further action or notice. If any other Event of Default occurs and is continuing, the Trustee or the holders of at least 25% in principal amount of the then outstanding Senior Notes may declare all the notes to be due and payable immediately.

Pursuant to the Registration Rights Agreement, the Issuers and the Guarantors will file an exchange offer registration statement with the SEC with respect to an offer to exchange the Senior Notes for substantially identical notes that are registered under the Securities Act within 90 days after the date of the issuance of the Senior Notes. The Issuers and the Guarantors will use their reasonable best efforts to cause the exchange offer registration statement to be declared effective under the Securities Act within 270 days after the date of the issuance of the Senior Notes. Additionally, the Issuers and the Guarantors have agreed to as soon as practicable after the exchange registration statement is declared effective by the SEC, offer the registered notes in exchange for the Senior Notes. Under some circumstances, in lieu of a registered exchange offer, the Issuers and the Guarantors have agreed to file a shelf registration statement with respect to the Senior Notes. The Issuers and the Guarantors are required to pay additional interest if they fail to comply with their obligations to register the Senior Notes within the specified time periods.

The description set forth above is qualified in its entirety by the Indenture, the form of Senior Notes and the Registration Rights Agreement, which are filed herewith as exhibits.
