- (1) This option was granted out of the Worthington Industries, Inc. 1997 Long-Term Incentive Plan and vests at 20% per year beginning on the first anniversary of the grant date (3/30/02). Date listed is the first day any portion of the option vested. Additional portions of 20% of the option vested annually on 3/30/2003, 3/30/2004, 3/30/05 and 3/30/06.

- (3) The account balances related to the theoretical common shares may be immediately transferred to other investment options under the terms of the deferred compensation plans.
